My dear Miss Bissell,

I am glad to report that we have sold the six hundred Red Cross Stamps sent to our New Century Club on 3<sup>rd</sup> of February. They have gone very slowly from the stores that undertook the sale of them, and the School Board declined to allow them <insertion: to be> sold in the schools; but I wish to ask for one hundred more, in the hope that a few persons may still be disposed to use them.

The Xmas stamps, we hope, will sell better than these.

Now, with respect to the proceeds:

Shall I send you my check to be credited to the account of Milford's patient in the Sanitarium?

Our King's Daughters<sup>1</sup> have sent one person to take the cure who has come home much benefited and now we have the second case there.

I feel that I ought to send the \$6.00 to you, but you suggested that we find some way to use the proceeds of our sales of stamps in our own community.
