

Letter, Emily Bissell to "Cousin Plantagenet," September 27, 1909

Sept 27, 1909

My dear Cousin Plantagenet:

The enclosed explains itself. As the president is away, the vice-president is in command, so I send it to you. I have written to Dr. Tomlinson and Robin, and asked the latter to look after Mr. Hatton,¹ but you may have to keep them all up to it by telephone. Mrs. Miller is away, and the others would add no strength, as they have no knowledge of the drainage plant part of the work.

I have sent Mr. Hilles my address here, in case anything is forwarded to me to sign. I shall be home by Oct. 3rd anyway.
