

Letter, Evelyn Sarde to Emily Bissell, December 9, 1907

My dear Miss Bissell:—

Was away from my house and in the mountains for months about three years ago. I think that I am a well woman to day and feel sure it can be cured when taken in time. I hope however to sell all these stamps and many more, though I doubt it in
