

Letter, S. A. Bailey to Emily Bissell, circa December 1909

Marshallton 12, 1909

Miss Bissell,

Having heard your request that you should be informed if any of your people trespassed on any of the people adjoining the Hospital, will inform you of a wholesale trespass of six carloads of Wilmington people on our private road, strewing it with cigarette boxes, papers, etc. etc. and shouting and other noises were very annoying to those loving a quiet Sabbath.

There was no need to use our lane as you have a landing on your own land, as well as one on the public road.

We do not propose to have our lane used as a thoroughfare from trolley to your buildings, and those using it hereafter will be treated as trespassers.
